I. REPORTS AND COMMENTS:

Superintendent's Report:

Mrs. Potter began by talking about the District working with MCOE on providing math coaches for our staff members as a way to improve our math instruction. This program will begin in the next couple of weeks with the tutors coming into the classrooms twice a month to observe and then offer their assistance to the teacher. Next, Mrs. Potter shared that the school sites participated in an earthquake shakeout drill in October. Also in October was the CHP inspection of the school buses as well as the paperwork and records. The inspection went very well and we had zero violations. Lastly, Mrs. Potter shared that Pedro and Marco have spent three full days at Spyrock School since we had our meeting there and they have been taking care of multiple maintenance issues that have come up.

K.2. Scheduling of Annual Organizational Meeting

- Education Code Section 35143 requires the Board of Trustees to hold an annual organizational meeting; this traditionally occurs in December during the regularly scheduled Board meeting. We will elect a President and Clerk, make committee assignments, adopt a calendar of meeting dates for 2018, and obtain signatures from each Board member.
- **Motion** to schedule the Board's annual organizational meeting for December 7, 2017 by Shannon Ford, seconded by Shelagh Deveney, unanimously approved with a 4-0 vote.

L. DISCUSSION / ACTION:

L.1. PUBLIC HEARING: Federal Impact Aid Program, Budget, BP 1261 and AR 1261

• LUSD is one of approximately 630 school districts that receive Federal Impact Aid funding. Federal regulations including Section 8004 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act and Board Policy 1261 call for an annual Public Hearing to be held in November to allow an opportunity for American Indian parents to discuss the

- educational programs supported by Impact Aid funds. A Public Hearing Notice was posted for 10 days, including at the Tribal Center.
- Federal Impact Aid funding is provided to districts with tax free entities in their jurisdictions such as Indian reservations and military bases. The purpose of the money is to offset the loss of tax revenue, to support the district's instructional program and to ensure that Indian children receive educational services equal to those received by non-Indian children. The revenue is based on a complex formula and has ranged from \$25,000 to \$45,000 over the past 10 years. BP and AR 1261, known as Indian Policies and Procedures (IPP's), provide Indian parents with the opportunity to participate in the discussions related to their students' instruction, and they provide the Board an opportunity to gather information concerning the American Indian community and its views on education.
- The Public Hearing was opened.
- No public input was given.
- The Public Hearing was closed.

L.2. Biennial Nutritional & Physical Activity Quality Indicators Review

• BP 5030 outlines the Board's policies in regards to student wellness with focus on nutrition and physical activity. The Board Policy was revised in June 2015. The Board is required to review this policy every two years.

L.3. Approval of Request for Allowance of Attendance Because of Emergency Conditions

- Due to the lack of communication tools (Phone, Internet), shortage of staff affected by the fire, and air quality caused by the Mendocino-Lake Complex Fire, Laytonville Schools were closed October 10, 2017 and October 11, 2017. The attached waiver requests that apportionments be maintained and instructional time credited to Laytonville Schools without regard to the fact that the schools were closed.
- **Motion** to approve form J-13A: Request for Allowance of Attendance Because of Emergency Conditions by Shelagh Deveney, seconded by Shannon Ford, unanimously approved with a 4-0 vote.
