I. REPORTS AND COMMENTS:

Superintendent's Report:

Indoor Energy Solutions has been working at the Elementary school to retrofit lighting fixtures with LEDs and to install motion sensors in each classroom and office. They also replaced a heater at the middle school with one that will be more energy efficient. Redwood Forest Foundation, Inc, the State Parks System and Sinkyone are working together to help fund an outdoor education program at Usal. Laytonville, Covelo and Leggett are being used to pilot this new program. Their goal is to start with creating a curriculum for 5-8th grade, each grade having a different program, using Usal as the learning environment. Lastly, the new classrooms are finally wrapping up. There are a few minor projects left including the covered walkway that drips because it is not yet connected to the new incline building. Plans for the room 10 modernization will be submitted next week and Don Alameida has been talking with modular construction experts about the new Culinary Arts project at the High School.

• We had two members of the Bond Oversight Committee resign, the parent member and the business owner member. We posted the openings and advertised in the newspaper for applicants. An expected application was not received prior to the meeting so the item was moved to the next meeting on November 1, 2018.

L. DISCUSSION / ACTION:

L.1. Revised Transportation Safety Plan

- The Transportation Safety Plan needed a minor update regarding Child Safety Alert Systems. The plan now includes information regarding procedures for insuring that students are not left unattended on school buses and the use of a child safety alert system.
- **Motion** to approve the revised Transportation Safety Plan by Erin Gamble, seconded by Shannon Ford, unanimously approved with a 5-0 vote.

L.2. Mendocino Co. Triennial Plan for Providing Education Services to Expelled Students

• AB 922 (EC 48660) was enacted in 1995 and provided for several changes in the placement process for expelled students. A major revision was that districts henceforth

would retain responsibility for the student's placement; the prior regulations provided for severing all legal responsibilities between the district and the student. The other revisions include county plans with placement options and a triennial update. EC 48660 also provides for Community Day Schools at the district and county level; the Plan coordinates services among the county LEA's.

- The attached Mendocino County Plan for Expelled Youth is an update of the previous three year plan. It was revised in consultation with all county districts. No major revisions to the last plan have been made, so adoption is not required, only a review is appropriate.
- **Motion** to approve the revised Mendocino County Triennial Plan for Expelled Youth by Shelagh Deveney, Seconded by Meagen Hedley, unanimously approved with a 5-0 vote.

L.3. Cell Phones on Campus

- During our August meeting the Board reviewed the current site policies regarding cell
 phones on campus. The Board asked to see sample policies from other Districts so those
 were provided.
- Mr. Henry discussed different ways in which the teachers have been utilizing cell phones in class:
 - o Teachers using the phones in class for educational purposes
 - o Culinary arts: photos are taken of the food for use in blogging
 - O Quizzlet: input data and use it to create a quiz
 - o Biology: flower identification
 - o Apps for disabling apps
- The Principals both found that the current school policies are effective.
